B A R C E L O N A

Park Guell is Antoni Gaudi's masterpiece. It is one of the most photographed sights in Barcelona. The park is covered with broken tiles and it overlooks the city. Purchase tickets at www.barcelona.cat for admission to the park.

La Boqueria Mercat is the biggest and famous market in Barcelona. You won't miss it especially the colorful fruit drinks that stands out as you walk in. You will see a variety of food stalls and hanging Iberico ham and various cured meats. Explore the market and be sure to go all the way to the very back of the market to where many of the the tapas bar are and sit among the locals while you enjoy a variety of tapas with sangria.

Gothic Quarter is a medieval square and the center of the old city of Barcelona where you can find many restaurants along the corridor. It is also Pablo Picasso's old stomping ground. Be sure to visit the Picasso Museum. Purchase tickets online.

Sagrada Familia is a famous church in Barcelona designed by Antoni Gaudi. This Catholic Church is part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Purchase tickets online to see this beautiful unfinished church.

Barcelona Cathedral is the Gothic cathedral and seat of the Archbishop of Barcelona, Catalonia, Spain. The cathedral was constructed from the thirteenth to fifteenth centuries, with the principal work done in the fourteenth century.

Rambla Del Mar is a wavy wooden walkway on the wharf.

Parc de la Guadellà is a park on the northeastern edge of Ciutat Vella, Barcelona, Catalonia, Spain. This 70-acre grounds has a city zoo, the Palau del Parlament de Catalunya, a small lake, museums, and a large fountain designed by Josep Fontserè.

Arc Del Triomf is Barcelona's triumphal arch. It was built by architect Josep Vilaseca I Casanovas as the main access gate for the 1888 Barcelona World Fair. The arch crosses over the wide central promenade of the Passeig de Lluís Companys, leading to the Ciutadella Park that now occupies the site of the world fair. It is located at the northern end of the promenade, facing the Passeig de Sant Joan.

Camp Nou is the home stadium of FC Barcelona. It has a seating capacity of 99,354 and it is the largest stadium in Spain and Europe, and the third largest football stadium in the world in capacity.

Montserrat is a multi-peaked mountain range near Barcelona, in Catalonia, Spain. It is part of the Catalan Pre-Coastal Range.

Castel de Montjuic is an old military fortress, with roots dating back from 1640. It is built on top of Montjuic hill in Barcelona, Catalonia, Spain. It currently serves as a Barcelona municipal facility.
